# YUVALOK SCHOOLS

21 years and YuvaLok Foundation still stands firm in Investing in Lives being child centred, youth centred and community centered. For the past 21 years YuvaLok has been focusing on children and youth who are less privileged and has been giving hope and opportunity to young people in poverty. We believe that education is the most effective tool which helps children build a strong foundation; enabling them to free themselves from the vicious cycle of ignorance, poverty and disease.

YuvaLok's journey for the year 2014-2015 has been one where we've crossed many hurdles, shared many smiles, wiped away many tears and stood our ground with pride in moulding and building up young citizens for a better tomorrow.

## The Story of Asha (name changed)

It isn't a secret that whole generations of girls are living without dignity, missing out on an education, a career, and livelihood simply because of a lack of these basic human rights. But for one girl today that is about to change! Today will be a turning point in her life.

Today is Graduation Day! At 16 years of age Asha will finally be draped in a simple yet elegant saree, and in front of the entire school receive awards for

General proficiency, Leadership & commitment and for being Best Captain for the year 2014 – 15. Her parents will be around to watch this proud moment and her classmates to cheer her.

The journey has not been an easy one. The years gone by have had its share of poverty, health issues, and no one else to lean on but her family. She's the third child if the four siblings. Living in a remote place they have erratic supply of electricity. Her home is an enclosure spread over 250 sq. ft. – a kitchen, bathroom and some extra space, no privacy whatsoever. But nothing and no one has stopped Asha. She has shown that it doesn't matter where you come from, it matters what you do with what you have.





Asha's parents are labourers and work at a construction site during the day and as watchmen during the night taking care of someone else's property. They have worked hard to provide for the family. Unlike many homes, amongst her family there is good unity. They have always been her support and pillar of strength. They have always motivated her to do her best and the unity their family shares has made Asha who she is today.

A peek into a day in Asha's life portrays a similar picture in many of the girls' life who study at YuvaLok. Asha wakes up when the sun hasn't risen and the night is just waning ~ 5:00am. No alarm clock to snooze and no one to call her name in case she wants to sleep in. At this early hour her job is to bring home heavy pots of water after waiting in line at the community tap nearby.

By 6:00am she sits to study for an hour before she helps her mother with some domestic chores along with her sister. She is fortunate to have breakfast which may not be nutritious but enough to settle the hunger inside.

7:45am she gets ready for school and she has to walk a long distance before she gets a bus to reach YuvaLok School.

By 8:45 she is in school and being a leader she is a role model, someone the other children look up to. She is never late and is always doing her best. She fulfills her duties at the morning assembly. She enjoys her day in school with friends and teachers. She loves her morning 9 grain nutritious porridge and also looks forward to her afternoon lunch provided by the school.

Quoting her she says, "Because the school provides us our morning porridge and mid-day meal, many children like me, are happy our food is taken care of". After spending an attentive day in class, Asha heads straight home.

She leaves school at 3:15pm and reaches her home by 5pm. After a small break she has work to do. She again needs to fetch water along with her sister and get the dinner ready before she can sit to her studies.



As she is a girl child she can't socialize with neighbors, there are no toys or X-boxes to keep her occupied or give her a little distraction. She has no money to just hang out with her friends. But she is content in her own little world. Another day is gone by and tomorrow will be the same.

Asha is one girl in a million. Many of them have to face the same or even worse scenarios day after day. YuvaLok plays a role in not only aiding the poor and destitute, but are implementing important development programs to ensure that this cycle of extreme poverty ends here. We believe that education is a stepping stone in eradicating poverty. We do our part but sometimes it's just not enough and wish we could do much more. This is where you can help!

High rise buildings and malls at every nook and corner. Restaurants feeding millions of people on a daily basis. The economy rises and falls. Concerts and movie premiers to keep the entertainment alive. Trains, busses, autos, the metro shuffling people in and out of homes and offices. Convenience stores for ease of the fast life. Crime on the rise each day. Amusement parks, resorts, and a lot more places to relax and have a little fun.

And in the middle of all the hustle and bustle of urban life, children – precious children - who can't afford a meal, whose parents can't take care of them, whose lives are a fight for survival. They don't know how or can't afford to have fun. Living in fear of what the day and night ahead will bring. Working hard so as to manage to eat one meal. Supporting their parents in any way possible. A child living the life of an adult.



In total contrast, rural India is known for its rustic beauty and for the cultural life that amazes not just the subcontinent but the entire world. This famous observation made by the Father of the Nation many years ago, still holds true. Villagers comprise the core of Indian society and also represent the real India. But there's another side to it - filled with stories of oppression, neglect, poverty and illiteracy faced by the dwellers of those areas. Change is what they need. But how does it begin?

In a bid to catalyse and rewrite this "change" story and trigger actions that would lead to positive outcomes, YuvaLok focuses on bringing up a generation who know how to read and write, who know how to build homes, who know how to celebrate life, who know how to come out of poverty and improve their lives... Who know how to achieve the impossible.

In the heart of the city and in rural India - this is where YuvaLok has made a difference and continues to do so through physical, mental and spiritual rejuvenation. YuvaLok Schools: YUVALOK HIGH SCHOOL HENNUR, YUVALOK HIGH SCHOOL KANNUR, YUVALOK SCHOOLS IN CHAMRAJNAGAR, YUVALOK SCHOOL IN KAMAGERE AND OUR TWO TRIBAL SCHOOLS – ONE IN MANKULAM, IDDUKI DIST. KERALA STATE AND THE OTHER IN CHAMRAJNAGAR NEAR MYSORE DIST, caters to the less privileged children who are economically weak and also those from dysfunctional homes. We also have on our rolls many children who are taken care of by a single parent. This year has seen the 8<sup>th</sup> batch of standard X students graduating. While the journey these past 21 years has been very challenging, the learning has propelled us to take YuvaLok to greater heights meeting the needs of communities in the education and nutritional areas by providing free education, text and note books, uniforms and nutrition.



At the YuvaLok schools we focus on a holistic approach catering to a child's intellectual, emotional, social, physical, creative and spiritual potentials. The nutrition intervention, a 9 grain organic porridge, takes care of the 2/3<sup>rd</sup> daily requirement of nutritional needs which keeps the child healthy and able to concentrate through the six hours the child is in our care each day. Safe drinking water and clean toilets add to the health and hygiene of the child. Need based experiential teaching develops the curiosity in our children and boosts their keenness to studies. Home environments are never conducive to do their homework. After all, children in the lower classes would prefer not to have homework. YuvaLok uses differential pedagogy methods to impart education without homework and makes learning fun.

At present YuvaLok schools are well equipped with all the facilities with 410 children at Hennur and



200 at Kannur. They are nurtured and instilled with values, integrity, compassion and respect which paves the way to success. We have well qualified teachers attending trainings to improve their personal and professional skills. Change is inevitable in the field of education. In the 2014 April exams we had 80% results, 10 of them scoring first class the topper with 80% by name Kanchan. The present X std with 39 students working very hard and moving forward with great expectations.

## HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR GONE BY

- Cathay Pacific: We had a team of 8 members interact with the children. They spent quality time relating with our children involving them in competitions, encouraging them and handing out prizes.
- Marnix Gymnasium: A team of 12 from Marnix Gymnasium headed by Miriam conducted various activities for our students. They divided themselves into four groups i.e. Arts & Craft, Dance, Music & Sports and showcased a small programme for the children.
- Bangalore International School: A group of students have been helping about 40 children in music and dance. The children were then invited to perform at the Bangalore International School.
- Target: Some of our students were given an opportunity to visit the Target office as part of the organizations International Grant Program celebrations. The children took part in various events and won a few prizes as well. Target has continued to render support to the school financially, through their monthly visits training our teachers in computers, soft skills for our students and in kind including books to the library.
- Thomson Reuters: Volunteers visited the school several times over the year to interact with the children. They conducted a number of games to impart knowledge, teamwork and sportsmanship and also encouraged the children to move around with confidence. They had a session on career counselling for the children of Class X.



- Painting Competition: Forty two children from classes VI – X representing their houses – Red, Blue, Green and Yellow were literally lost in colours. They were all engrossed in paints and brushes and offered their creativity on the given topic 'Save Our Planet- Earth' so that the future generation will also have the opportunity to enjoy God's creation. ).
- December 5th, Sports Day – a day of sportsmanship. Each child is encouraged to participate in the 'Annual Sports Day' of the school. The school flag was hoisted by our Programme Director Mrs. Shobha Louis followed by Oath taking by Sports Vice Captain Pawan Kalyan of std IX. Our Chief guest Smt Tejaswini - Corporator, Horamavu graciously took time to be with our children encouraging and supporting them. The participating students display their strengths and ability on the field. Through this day students learn to accept both victory and defeat with grace.
- Teacher's Training - Great teachers help create great students. YuvaLok provides our educators' opportunities that enable them sharpen their abilities, expand their views and improve their ability to integrate tools and resources into their classrooms. This year YuvaLok has had the following sessions to revitalize our educators: Differentiated Teaching, Teachers Upliftment Programme, Basic Emergency Medical Care, Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation, Flow Of English And Child Protection In India.



## Volunteers

Volunteers are wanted at YuvaLok.

Throughout the year we have volunteers both local and overseas who join us for either short term or long term periods. This includes overseas institutions and local fellowship and colleges. Overseas Volunteers come from the Netherlands, USA & UK. Locally we have students coming over from various colleges and fellowships.

# PLACING POVERTY BEHIND

Walking down the roads of Doddagubbi you'll find an old village. The shops there are old and have served many people over the years. The living quarters of people are made of mud and stones with thatched roofs. The residents smile as you walk by. This is the neighbourhood of Thejas.

You'll find a father who had to undergo two surgeries which left him bedridden for over two years. With assistance from a local doctor he slowly and painfully regained his strength and with utter determination he began to walk again. With no other source of income and having to take care of a 5 member family, this man decided to buy a second hand auto-rickshaw with the help of a loan and earn his daily bread. With all his energy focused on earning money he pays off the monthly loan EMI. But what he earns isn't enough to take care of his family.

You'll find a mother who is a diabetic; she has no money to pay for her medication. All she can do is take precautions. She has been the pillar of strength when things have been difficult in this home. She works during the day at a nearby school and brings in a small income which helps in keeping the fire burning.

Unable to afford to send their children to school, the parents are forced to deal with the guilt that nags at them every time they look into their children's faces. With no education, these little ones are likely destined to follow in their parents' footsteps and end up in a place like this, if they survive at all.

Look a little more and you'll find their son, Thejas. He wakes up early in the morning, gets his dad's auto rickshaw cleaned and attends to his daily chores at home. He helps around at home as much as possible as he's seen the hardship his family has undergone. Helping at home makes the burden lighter for his mother and father. But what else can he do? YuvaLok has given this child hope. He has life to look forward to. We took him in, provided books, a bag, clothes and two nutritious meals each day. And Thejas has been grateful.

He is presently in the 8<sup>th</sup> Standard is saddened by the plight of his dad and his family condition, but this deterrent has been his motivation to do well in his academics and pursue his ambition to be a Chartered Accountant someday. His desire is to do professionally well and see that his family is well in all respects. He looks forward to the days when poverty will be history in his family.

His teacher talks highly of him as a hard worker, very disciplined and he is focused on attaining his goal. This is not a desire that has dawned on him recently, right from his early days in school he has worked hard and it has paid off. He has always been either 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> in class. In fact on his father's advice he has refused to take on leadership roles in school so that he can stay focused on academics. That's the level of commitment Thejas shows.

While Thejas is a role model to his other peers, he says his dad is his role model. He has sacrificed much to see that his son will not have to tread the path he has and be successful in life in every area and be of help in whatever way possible to his local community.



# A FUTURE THROUGH SACRIFICE

Children were to be seen everywhere as she looked out the window of her little home. They played on the rough ground and vacant lots, in the open spaces where garbage was strewn. The parked rickshaws and vending carts all served as play props in the streets. Small children could be seen outdoors walking around barefoot, climbing on debris and petting goats and cows that freely roamed around. Girls carrying infants and toddlers on their hip and moving around freely in the narrow lanes.

Muskan watches with a heart full of longing but with a mind firmly grounded. She longs to be a child, to play on those same streets, to run around, laugh and enjoy some time with friends. But she has rules to follow and one of them is that she can go out to play only once her mother returns home. That is usually by 6.00 pm. By then all the other children have gone back to their homes.

Recreation isn't something that she has the freedom to enjoy. It's all work and no play for this 7<sup>th</sup> standard girl from YuvaLok School. Time has calmed that longing in her heart and now she shows no disappointment. She wants to live up to her mother's dreams and become a successful professional.

Muskan is no stranger to tragedy. When she was just 6 years old, she lost her father. Her mother had the burden of raising her 3 children on her own. No family to help. She tried hard to earn a living by taking up different jobs and varying times but the ones who suffered were her children and she couldn't bear to see that.

Then one day Muskan's grandmother from Andhra Pradesh who was a widow came forward to support her daughter by promising to take care of the grandchildren. She moved to Bangalore as soon as she could and this gave Muskan's mother the opportunity to get a job at a garment factory. She was earning a small salary and found it very difficult to make ends meet. The grandmother too decided to work making Muskan to take care of the siblings. She got a housekeeping job at YuvaLok School and at that time approached the school authorities to give admission to her 3 grandchildren.

Muskan remembers her first day at school, "I was scared and really not sure what to expect. For me the fear was that the other students will make fun of me. But at the same time I was really happy and excited, looking forward to going to school. They even gave me a school bag with my new text books and notes books along with my new uniform. And it was free!"

Looking back these past 5 years Muskan says, “If not for YuvaLok School and the love the teachers show me, I would have been working somewhere or been on the streets. This is my second home and I love my teachers and friends. They support me and encourage me both in class and on the playing field.”

She enjoys her afternoon lunch sitting along with her friends and having a hot nutritious meal. She is not too happy with the morning porridge but says she has it only because it is nutritious and it keeps her stomach full till lunch time.

Interestingly, Muskan's mother has decided not to remarry because she has committed her life for the cause of her children. She wants to see them well educated and successful in life. Even though they live in a very small house and have the bare essentials to get them through each day, the family is content.

“God will bless us and life will get better for my family,” says Muskan as she expresses her gratitude to her mother for her sacrifice in life to see the 3 siblings educated and successful. “My inspiration is my mother and she has taught me patience, honesty and loyalty, this I know along with my hard work will take me to great heights.”

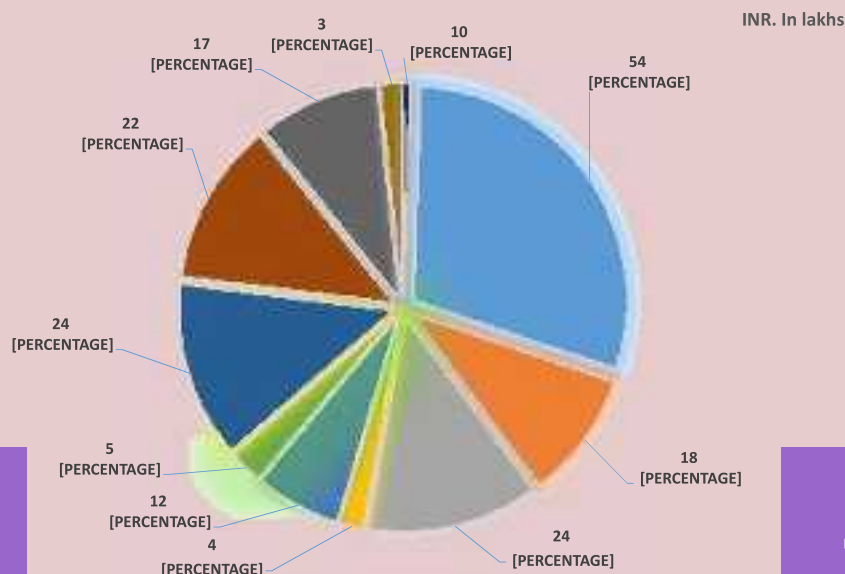
